**Plumbing, Mechanical Industry and Water Efficiency Leaders to Co-Convene
Seventh Emerging Water Technology Symposium in 2020**

Ontario, Calif. (Dec. 5, 2019) — Preparations are already underway to ensure that the 2020 Emerging Water Technology Symposium (EWTS), to be held May 12-13, 2020, at the Westin Riverwalk in San Antonio, is the most comprehensive and informative event since the symposium debuted in 2008. The EWTS is designed to provide a portal for the host organizations’ partners in the manufacturing, engineering and trade industries to display and demonstrate their innovative solutions to legislative and regulatory developments that often alter industry landscapes.
